Dr Nelson is an Australian registered psychologist and social scientist who specializes in Transpersonal Counselling, personal and business coaching, and human experience and behavioural research. His work with individuals focuses primarily on developing fluidity of attention, which facilitates the expansion of awareness. This kind of re-orientation of perception allows clients to experience the world in a refreshed manner, facilitating problem solving as well as deepening awareness. During his first career in neuroscience he conducted research into the psychophysiology of attention, perception, consciousness and language processing. As well as his experimental work, he produced a mathematical model based on 'n-like' sensory neurons that was able to simulate a more accurate version of the Weber-Fechner law. Along the way in the late 1960s he co-designed and built an original biofeedback device for EEG training for therapeutic purposes, which he sold to a major US electronics manufacturer (Dewey Electronics).

Later, Dr Nelson became a social scientist and focused his research on how people experience and understand reality—whether seen through the visions of mystics or the daily perceptions of ordinary people. As part of this research work he developed an original statistical psycho-phenomenological methodology for studying and modelling the factors underlying how individuals assemble perceptions into the narratives they construe as the real world.
